You have the verb “aller” which is an irregular verb.

Irregular verbs are verbs that don't follow a regular pattern throughout the conjugation. Although the irregular verbs can present a bit of a challenge, you can master them with some practice and a little memorization.

Below is the present tense conjugation of **aller**.

Je vais

Tu vas

Il/elle /on va

Nous allons

Vous allez

Ils/elles vont

You use the verb aller when you want to say you're going to the store or to the movies etc.

Contractions of the French Definite Article – the Mutant Forms “au, aux,

(Just to revise with you what definite articles are😊)

1 – Forms of the French Definite Articles

The French definite article has four forms:

1. Le (masculine singular),
2. La (feminine singular),
3. L' (followed by a vowel),
4. Les (plural).

Now, here is what often confuses students.

The definite article contracts with the prepositions “à” to create a “mutant” form:

1. À + le = au
Je vais au supermarché (I am going to the supermarket)
2. À + les = aux
Je parle aux amis de ma soeur (I speak to the friends of my sister)
3. **À + l' and à + la do not contract.**

À + l' = à l'

à + la = à la
